# GREATER ENRICHMENT PROGRAM RECEIVES NEW BIKES FOR STUDENTS FOR THE HOLIDAYS

 UNTIL Foundation donates bikes and helmets to every Greater Enrichment Program student at the Ashley Park Elementary site –

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – Greater Enrichment Program (GEP), a not-for-profit, afterschool academic and cultural enrichment program, has announced it will receive more than 80 brand new bikes and helmets for every student who attends GEP at the Ashley Park Elementary site. All of the bikes and helmets are being donated by UNTIL Foundation, a not-for-profit organization whose mission is to improve the lives of children who are in foster care and underprivileged.

UNTIL Foundation will present each child with his or her very own bike and helmet this Saturday, December 14 at the GEP administrative office from 10 a.m. to noon. Trek Bicycle Corporation representatives also will be present to personally fit the bike and helmet to each child.

UNTIL Foundation does not receive any government grants and strictly operates through personal, individual financial contributions, which made the bike donations possible. The foundation will donate nearly 200 bikes throughout the Charlotte community, including the 83 that will be given to GEP.

"We wanted to give these children something they could enjoy, use for physical activity and be proud of," said Deborah Edge, founder of UNTIL Foundation. "Through our wonderful, generous contributions from private donors, we are able to make this possible."
