




ACADEMIC & CULTURAL ENRICHMENT

At GEP students receive a healthy snack, homework assistance, literacy and/or STEM enrichment, physical fitness, a safe ride home and cultural enrichment (field trips, special facilitators, community partnerships). GEP students participated in 60 hours of teacher-directed activities, 20 hours of technology time, 36 hours of STEM, 100 hours of physical fitness and cultural enrichment activities, including:

- Financial literacy program with Wells Fargo
- Diamond Dell Gem Mining Experience
- STEM activities including designing roller coasters and creating DNA helices with candy
- Summer in the City Day Camp reading challenge
- Girls' empowerment workshop series
- The Nutcracker Ballet with Charlotte Youth Ballet
- Substance abuse prevention workshop with Anuvia
- Etiquette workshop with Touch Inc.



STUDENT ACADEMIC GROWTH

- 92% of third through eighth grade students maintained or improved their grades from first through fourth quarters in math
- 89% of third through eighth grade students maintained or improved their grades from first though fourth quarters in reading
- 93% of kindergarten students at the Merry Oaks GEP site are at or above the Text Reading Comprehension level
- 70% of first grade students at the Merry Oaks site are at or above the Text Reading Comprehension level
- Oaks site are at or above the Text
 Reading Comprehension level
- Ashley Park passed the Math EOG compared to 47% overall at the school
- 27% passed the Reading EOG compared to 17% overall at the school

To encourage involvement and engage parents in their children's education, GEP requires all parents or guardians to volunteer at program events and activities. GEP achieved **100%** parent participation for 2015-2016 with more than 1,000 hours in volunteer time.

Students are required to participate in community service projects each quarter, and the staff works closely with the GEP Student Advisory Board to come up with project ideas.
